

**VILLAGE OF DUBBERLY
PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL
JUNE 10, 2019**

The Village of Dubberly met for its regular monthly meeting on Monday, June 10, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.

Notice of meeting was posted on the marquee sign at 12:00 Noon on Friday, June 7, 2019.

Those present were Curtis Hirth, Charles Mims, Johnny Brown, Douglas Culpepper and Jeff Lair.

The meeting was opened in prayer by Douglas Culpepper and followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes from the regular meeting of May 13, 2019 were read and a motion was made by Johnny Brown and seconded by Douglas Culpepper to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Johnny Brown and seconded by Douglas Culpepper to accept financial reports. Motion carried.

Chief Mims reported that in May he responded to 6 calls, issued 5 citations and did not collect any fines.

Curtis addressed the question on commercial accounts that was tabled last month. Several other water systems were called to see how they determined if a customer should be a commercial account. Dixie Inn – if they have a business name and carry liability insurance for the events, they are commercial. Sibley – If they use the home to make money, they consider them commercial. Cotton Valley - If they use the home for business purposes, they are considered commercial. David Ryals with the LRWA said their standard is if they have a tax ID number and are required to collect and pay sales tax on the services provided from their home they are commercial. Johnny moved to table the discussion until next month to obtain more information.

Johnny Brown spoke with Delta Processing, the VFD's have been ordered and it will take three weeks to get them. He also spoke with Stewart Burson of Dixie Overland Construction and he is still working on the final plans for the Catalpa building.

There being no further business, motion made by Johnny Brown and seconded by Douglas Culpepper to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 6:59 p.m.
